**Numerals on Colored Paper**

On May 1, 1851, the first definitive stamps, were issued in the Grand Duchy of Baden. With these denominations, all important postage tariffs were covered in both distance and weight. Baden's first four stamps were designed on the model of Bavaria's stamps. "Freimarke" means definitive stamp and "Deutsch-Österreichischer-Postverein / Vertrag 6. April 1850" is translated German-Austrian Postal Union / Treaty April 6, 1850, indicating their joining of the postal union.
