REPRINTS (Official imitations) 1889. 5c - originals have two small dots near the left side of the square in the upper right corner. These dots are missing on the reprints. 13c - the bottom of the 3 of 13 in the upper left corner is flattened in the originals and rounded in the reprints. The "t" of the "Cts" on the left side is as tall as the "C" in the reprints, but shorter in the originals. On August 19th. 1882, the remaining supply of reprints was overprinted in black "REPRINT". The reprints (both with and without the overprint) were sold at face value.

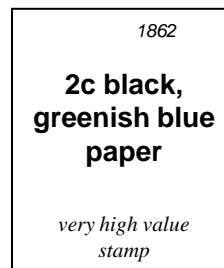

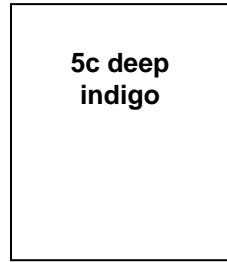
In 1885 the Postmaster General wished to have on sale complete sets of Hawaii's stamps as far back as the type of 1861-63, but was unable to find either the stone from which #27 and #28 or the plate from which #29 was printed. He therefore sent a copy of #29 to the American Bank Note Co. with an order to engrave a new plate and print 10,000 stamps, of which 5000 were overprinted "Specimen" in blue. The original #29 was printed in sheets of 15 (5x3), but the plate of these "official imitations" was made up of 50 stamps (10x5). Later, in 1887, the original die for #29 as discovered, and after retouching, a new plate was made and 37,000 stamps were printed. These, like the originals, were printed in sheets of 15. They were delivered during 1889 and 1890. In 1892, all remaining unsold in the Post Office were overprinted "reprint".
